Community Connection Centre

The staff at the Community Connection Centre provide information to adults, seniors and families seeking resources for various local and government programs. Referrals are made to other agencies that provide a variety of programs and services (i.e. financial assistance, housing, counselling, etc.)

You will also find the following services at the Community Connection Centre:

Sunshine Bus Transportation

A growing number of older adults and people with mobility issues in the Town of Olds who want to live in their own homes face barriers to accessing the non-medical services they need to live independently in the community, including accessible and affordable transportation. Older adults or those with mobility issues have priority booking status and can book the bus two days or more in advance of the day needed to ensure time slot availability.

Priority Booking:

- Older adults or those with disabilities receive priority.
- To meet priority booking guidelines, the trip must be booked a minimum of 2 business days before the appointment.

Payment Options:

\$5.00 / one way per person

Punch Pass (11 trip punch pass) - \$50.00 / One punch per person

Cash or Punch Pass only.

Punch Passes can be purchased at the Town Administration Office (4512-46 St.), or the Olds Aquatic Centre (5303 46 Ave) by cash, credit or debit.

Punch passes can also be purchased from the bus driver or at the Community Connection Centre (4911-51 Ave.) but by cash only.

Call to book your ride:

Call the booking line (403-556-8003) Monday to Friday between 9 am – 11 am and one of the volunteer dispatchers will reserve the timeslot for your trip.

Subsidized Housekeeping Program (65+)

The Community Connection Centre wants to help older people stay in their own homes as they get older. They have a program to help pay for house cleaning. This program is for seniors who need help but don't qualify for a similar program from the province.

Seniors Health Nurse

Who can benefit from this service?

The Seniors Health Nurse supports adults (≥ 65 years) through the aging journey. Our Seniors Health Registered Nurse is available to complete a thorough evaluation of the medical, functional and social needs of you, or a family member who may be experiencing concerns regarding healthy aging.

What happens at my appointments?

You will have individual appointments with our Seniors Health Registered Nurse who will work with you, your family/caregiver and your family doctor to develop a care plan to best meet the needs of you and your family. Through our emphasis on person-centred care, you will work in partnership with our nurse to help you navigate community and health services with a goal of maximizing overall healthy aging.

How do I access the service?

You can access this service by asking for a referral from your Peaks to Prairies PCN family physician. This service is by appointment only.

Where is the service located?

Our Registered Nurse sees patients in both Olds and also can visit you in your home. Appointments are available Wednesday to Friday from 8:30 – 4:30.

Connect Seniors (ASC) Accredited Supports to the Community

Serves seniors and older adults (55 plus) in the Mountain View County region who require supports to feel safe, secure, and socially connected while they remain living in their homes as they age.

Services are provided as a fee for service and a sliding fee scale is available for as long as there are program funds available. Access to the sliding fee scale is based on recorded annual gross income.

The service fee can slide from \$8.25 – \$33 per hour; and the transportation fee can slide from \$0.13 to \$0.50 per kilometre.

Required services are determined by the client and/or their caregivers and will be delivered by a team of professional and trained staff using a person-centered approach.

Services include:

System Navigation: provides access to and knowledge of relevant community support services and resources relevant to their needs (income and government support services support, homeowner services).

Transportation: escorted transportation, utilizing CSS staff-owned vehicles to provide support to attend medical and non-medical appointments within the Olds area, including shopping, errands, and social events.

Companionship: staff will spend time with you in your home, doing activities you enjoy, addressing loneliness or isolation and increasing your sense of safety and well-being.

Social Support Connections: staff will provide transportation so you can attend community events, visit with friends, or do other day-to-day things you enjoy.

Respite: provides primary caregivers with a break from caregiving.

Homemaking: staff will assist with meal clean up and general tidying or will make referrals for full housekeeping services.

Meal Support: staff will assist with meal planning, shopping, and preparation, and provide companionship during meals.

Home and Hospital Hospice Care

Our team provides support to individuals and families, whether at home or in the hospital. Nu2U - A Community - Focused Service

Nu2u is a valuable community resource, and provides a small amount of funding for the Hospice Society Operations. Nu2u is a fantastic place and is both a community service and sustainability initiative.

Seniors Outreach Nurses: provide specialized mental health and cognitive assessment, consultation and education to assist seniors to remain in their home communities for as long as appropriate and/or possible. The nurses meet seniors where they live (own home, lodges, designated supportive living sites, long term care, and acute care).

Alzheimer's Society of Alberta and Northwest Territories

First Link is a referral program designed to help newly diagnosed people with dementia get the help they need as soon as possible.

The Alzheimer Society provides services and support at the time of diagnosis and throughout the duration of the disease. Individuals and their families are linked to learning, services and support as early as possible in the disease process.

It is often difficult for individuals and families affected by dementia to ask for help. Many families are told about the Alzheimer Society and dementia care services, but will not actually make the phone call until a crisis occurs.

The First Link program removes this barrier to support by ensuring that individuals and families are referred directly to First Link at the time of diagnosis or as soon as possible after a diagnosis is made.

Formal referral comes from physicians and other health-care providers (i.e. allied health professionals), diagnostic and treatment services, and community service providers.

Dr. Kristen Jacklin founded the Indigenous Cognition & Aging Awareness Research Exchange (I-CAARE) in 2015.

The goals of I-CAARE are to (1) explore and promote healthy aging with Indigenous peoples, and (2) raise awareness about cognitive health in Indigenous communities.

Team 20 has two focus areas: rural and Indigenous. The Indigenous team is the only team within the CCNA investigating neurodegenerative diseases in Indigenous communities. For this, we have received partner funding from the Institute of Aboriginal Peoples Health at CIHR to research quality of life for Indigenous people affected by age-related dementia.
