# MVC declines to approve Parkland Regional Library System's budget

Mountain View County's council has declined to approve the proposed 2026 Parkland Regional Library System (PLRS) budget, which called for a per capita rate increase from \$9.81 to \$9.99.

# County officials consider participation in new Central Alberta economic group

During a recent, regularly-scheduled council meeting, councillors carried the following motion: "That council direct administration to prepare a project sheet for the 2026 budget to reflect participation in Central Alberta First (CAF) for \$10,000."

The motion came after council received and reviewed the recently released Business Retention and Expansion Workshop Development (BREWD) report.

In 2023, the county contributed \$10,000 in the BREWD initiative, a collaboration project with the Town of Olds and other nearby municipalities.
