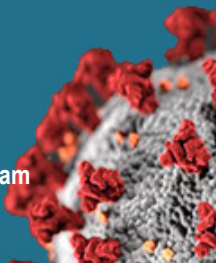

## Economic Development Coordinator

As the Economic Development Coordinator for the Town of Olds, you will be a key contributor to the success of our local economy and in making Olds a great place in which to live, work and play. Every day you will collaborate with developers, business owners, staff, and community members to make Olds an attractive place to start or expand a business or invest in business opportunities. To be successful in this role you must be a motivated professional with experience in the promotion of economic growth through business and investment strategies, understanding that every community has different advantages to be used to make it a thriving community; that there is no cookie cutter approach to economic development, that a variety of tools and approaches are needed for each unique situation.

In 2019, the Town issued 108 development permits with a value of \$33,528,760. Despite COVID, in 2020 the Town issued 92 permits for a value of \$30,839,664. Olds is home to approximately 610 businesses, of which about 150 are home-based, a growing industrial base, and the annexation of 480 acres underway. ## Summer Staff Operations - 15 Positions

The Town of Olds is accepting applications for fifteen (15) summer staff positions from May 3, 2021 to August 27, 2021. Applicants are to provide a three year Drivers Abstract with their application, these can be obtained at any Alberta Registries location.

Hours of Work: 7:00 am to 3:30 pm, Monday to Friday; Half-hour unpaid lunch; two 15 minute paid breaks and may require some weekend and shift work.

Qualifications: Valid Class 5 Drivers' License, and a willingness to learn. Students or recent graduates of horticulture, landscaping, civil construction, or engineering related programs are encouraged to apply. ## Manager of Operations

The Town of Olds Operations department maintains 208 km of underground infrastructure, 104 km of roads, 18 km of paved trails, 2 km of unpaved trails, over 350 acres of parks, and more for our 9,184 residents. This position reports to the Director of Operations and through 4 direct reports and 1 administrative assistant, is responsible for the Building Maintenance, Parks, Public Works, and Utilities divisions of the Town of Olds. The Manager works with their direct reports to coordinating projects, staff, and resources to achieve the service levels set by Council. Working with the Engineering Technologist, the incumbent will ensure contractors, developers, and builders adhere to the Town of Olds Design Standards. This position aids the Director of Operations with budgeting, capital project planning and provides information and updates related projects and question from Council.
