The Town of Olds is accepting applications for the Nu2U Supervisor position for a one-year term. Reporting to the Manager of Community Services, the successful applicant will plan, direct, and manage all aspects of the day-to-day operations of the Nu2U Thrift Store, found at 5032 51 Street. Responsibilities include creating and maintaining a physically-safe and visually-appealing retail outlet, overseeing the sorting, cleaning, display and pricing of all merchandise, recruiting, training and supervising staff volunteers, monitoring expenses and revenues, providing monthly reports, and promoting products and volunteer opportunities available at Nu2U.

Previous experience in retail services and volunteer development is required. Candidates will have a working knowledge of computers and office software (word processing, spreadsheets, databases) and other office equipment. Applicants must have strong organizational and time management skills, experience and knowledge providing excellent customer service, and the ability to promote and practice building relationships among interest groups, volunteers, and the public.

Heritage Day - Monday, August 3, 2020

Heritage Day is celebrated in Alberta on the first Monday of August each year. Although it is not a statutory holiday, many Canadians in Alberta use this day as an optional holiday to celebrate the province's heritage.

In 1974 the Alberta Government declared the first Monday of August an annual holiday to recognize and celebrate the varied cultural heritage of Albertans. Alberta's Heritage Day is in addition to the national Heritage Day holiday, created in 1973 and held on the third Monday of February to celebrate the country's history and architecture. Heritage Day is not an official national holiday, but is widely recognized throughout Canada.

To learn more about the rich cultural heritage found in our community or to research Olds and area development, visit the Mountain View Museum and Archives at 5038-50th Street. Summer hours are Noon to 4 pm Tuesdays, Wednesday to Friday 11 am to 4 pm, and Saturdays from 1 pm to 4 pm.
