Winter makes dumping green bins difficult

Compost Tips

To help compost green bins dump easily in cold weather, line your bin with newspaper flyer sheets (not glossy flyers) crumbled into balls and put in the bottom of your green bin. Newspaper, paper bags or soiled pizza boxes can also be used.

You can put food-soiled pizza boxes (dried-on cheese, food chunks, sauce splatters etc.) in your green cart to be composted.



Flashing Red. Kids Ahead

Effective December 1, 2020

All school buses will begin to use the eight-way flashing red flashing lights when picking-up and dropping-off students in the Town of Olds. Drivers will be required to **stop** in both directions. This means it is illegal to pass a school bus in either direction when lights are flashing.
