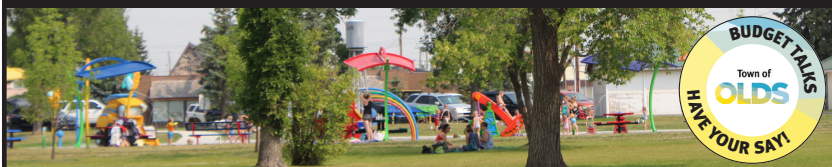

Despite COVID, to the end of July, the Town has issued 45 permits for a value of \$3,830,735. The Town has an opening for a full time Development Officer. This position will work as part of the Planning and Development team to guide and evaluate applications for development, subdivision and land use bylaw amendments and acts as a resource to the public, other staff and the Municipal Planning Commission. The incumbent will also be responsible for the application and interpretation of the Land Use Bylaw and other statutory planning documents.
