# **Olds Fire Department Awarded Grain Rescue Equipment**

The Town of Olds Fire Department has been awarded grain rescue equipment from the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association (CASA), in partnership with Corteva Agriscience Canada

The department participated in BeGrainSafe (CASA's grain safety program) in the summer of 2019. The BeGrainSafe training consists of one day of theory and a second day of practical training and evaluation, with an emphasis placed on fire fighters learning how to safely extract an individual trapped in grain, using a cofferdam and auger.

While training is key, a successful rescue could not happen without the proper equipment. CASA, in partnership with Corteva Agriscience, has provided Olds Fire Department with a GSI RES-Q-TUBE and a Haul-ALL pencil auger, both of which are essential in rescuing a grain entrapment victim. When used in combination, the grain rescue tube creates a barrier between the victim and the grain while the auger helps rescuers quickly move the grain away from the victim. Mayor Michael Muzychka and Councillor Al Kemmere voiced how extremely fortunate Mountain View County is to have this type of rescue equipment

The BeGrainSafe program emphasizes prevention and raises awareness on the dangers of grain, alongside preparing fire departments for grain rescues. It is important that fire departments are well trained and prepared with the proper equipment in the case of an incident. Thanks to Corteva Agriscience, this life-saving equipment will be in the hands of those who need it.

### Policing Advisory Committee (OPAC)

The Olds Policing Advisory Committee (OPAC) was launched in January to provide a forum to receive input from the community with respect to public safety matters. This committee consists of five members of the public and two members of council who meet regularly to ensure the Olds community has safe, effective and fair policing through public input. Comittee members have a wide range of experience and expertise including social services, working with youth and business backgrounds.

A 2021 Olds RCMP policing priorities survey has been launched asking:

- What are the top three policing priorities in Olds?
- Are local RCMP detachment staff approachable and accessible?
- Do you feel there are areas that could be improved upon?

The survey takes about 2 minutes and it will help ensure RCMP priorities align with those of area residents. The survey will remain open until March 14, 2021.


